

ATV Regulations for Eagle Creek Regional Park

DEFINITION

All Terrain Vehicle means a self-propelled vehicle that is designed primarily for the movement of people or goods on unprepared surfaces and has wheels in contact with the ground. In Eagle Creek Regional Park, this includes quads, motorbikes, mini-bikes, dirt bikes, and all terrain utility vehicles. Under no circumstance are go-cart, go-cart style vehicles, pocket bikes or any other vehicles modified for ATV use **allowed in the park**. Golf carts are exempt.

REGULATIONS

A) All ATVs must be registered by the park, in order to operate within the park. Registrants will be asked to provide the name of their insurer and their insurance policy number. Owners must provide the park with the make, model, year, serial number and color of their ATV. All machines must display the license plate as provided by the Park. Registered owner must renew registration annually.

B) The cost of yearly registration will be \$25 for all ATV's regardless of time spent within the park. All ATV's must display their park plate so that they are clean and visible from the rear of the ATV at all times.

C) ATVs are to be used on designated roads and trails . Under no circumstance are ATVs allowed on board walks or prohibited hiking trails. ATV's are to be used only to travel from point A to point B.

D) All ATV operators must abide by the Saskatchewan Highway Act and the Saskatchewan ATV Act.

E) Drivers of ATVs must have a valid driver's license. No exceptions.

F) Any operator of, or passenger in or on, an all terrain vehicle under the age of 19 must wear a helmet and protection.

G) ATV's can be operated in the Park from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. or 1/2 hour before sunset, whichever applies. All ATV's operated after dark are to be equipped with a working front light, and the 11 pm quiet time must be respected. ATV's operated after dark are only allowed to travel from point A to point B.

H) Failure to follow these rules may result in fines and or eviction from the Park.

I) Operators of golf carts that have not been modified from factory specifications, are not transporting more passengers than there are factory installed seats, and are not capable of reaching speeds of more than 15 km/h will not be required to wear helmets or eye protection. When not on the golf course, anyone under 16 years of age must be accompanied by a guardian or parent at all times.
