Brightsand Lake Regional Park Camping Regulations

Revised 19/11/2016

- A) Permit holders shall maintain the camping site and camping unit in a condition acceptable to the park management.
- B) Only one camping unit (tent, tent-trailer, camper, camper-truck/van, camping trailer or motor home) is allowed per campsite. Mobile homes and bunkhouse type trailers are not allowed. All units/sites must be maintained so as not to detract from the park setting. Due to camp size, length restrictions may apply. All units/equipment must be contained within the sites.
- C) One small tent per single site for accommodating dependent children and one screened tent for meal purposes may be allowed with prior approval of the management and depending on the size of the camp site. No other structures are permitted.
- D) A limit of 6 people per campsite is allowed for non immediate family groups.
- E) Visitors to campsites must possess and display a valid park entry permit and visit only between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. Campsite information will not be released without written consent.
- F) Quiet time is from 11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m.
- G) Check in time is 3:00 p.m.
- H) Check out time is 11:00 a.m. When checking out, please notify the office. If you wish to stay longer, please notify the main office to see what is available.
- I) If there are any problems with the site you are in, please notify the office. Do not move to another campsite because it is empty.
- J) The park provides only one picnic table and one fire pit per site.
- K) Removable ground level decks/landings to a maximum of 80 sq. ft. (7.43 m. sq.) will be allowed upon approval of the park management. These must be removed from the site at time of departure. Anyone failing to comply with this will be liable for any damages caused.
- L) Fires are allowed in park provided fireplace/barbeques only. Under no circumstance are these fire pits to be moved from where the park management has situated them. Propane or other non-wood burning portable barbeques are acceptable for cooking purposes. Under no circumstances are fires to be left unattended. Anyone failing to comply with this will be liable for any damages caused.
- M) The park determines the use of power plants/generators in campgrounds. Generators may be used between 8:00 A.M. and 11:00 P.M. Failure to comply with the generator hours of operation will result in eviction.
- N) Any combination of tarps may not exceed 400 sq. ft. (37.16m.sq.). For security reasons, tarps cannot obstruct the view of park personnel.

- O) All camping units and vehicles, other than tents and truck campers, must be legally registered and display a current, valid license plate at all times when on park land.
- P) All vehicles must be parked in such a manner as not to obstruct traffic.
- Q) The permit holder, their family and guests shall comply at all times with all permit conditions and regulations. The permit holder is responsible for the conduct and behaviour of their family and guests. Everyone must observe all campground regulations and conditions. Excessive noise is not permitted at any time. Please be considerate of others in the park.
- R) Pets must be kept leashed and attended at all times. There are to be no pets on the main beach. An area is provided for pets by the boat launch. There are to be no pets in the shower house or on the mini golf. Pet owners must ensure that pet litter is cleaned up. Please be considerate of your neighbour.
- S) Alcoholic beverages may be consumed in the permit holder's camping unit and on their assigned site, in accordance with The Alcohol and Gaming Regulation Act as per Section 107 (1) per 139 (1). The consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited in public areas (golf course, beach, etc.)
- T) Major appliances are restricted to those fixed in the camping unit/contained within the original unit's construction. With the approval of Park management, refrigerators may be used providing they are secured in a manner such that they cannot tip or fall over, doors must be locked, and a monthly fee of \$25.00 paid to cover the cost of power.
- U) Lights are restricted to a maximum of 12 patio lights (1 string) or one (1) section of lights per site. All lights must be CSA approved.
- V) Cutting down trees or damaging or vandalizing park property will not be tolerated.
- W) Litter barrels are supplied throughout the park and recreation areas. Please use them and help keep the park clean.
- X) Complaints are to be filed at the main office. You will be asked to file a written complaint. Management will then deal with the issue.
- Y) Fireworks are prohibited. No one shall ignite, explode, discharge or detonate any pyrotechnic device within the Park boundaries.
- Z) Minimum age to reserve a camp site is 19. Occupants of a camp site must be a minimum of 19 years of age, or accompanied by a parent or legal guardian at all times.
 - ** Failure to comply with the above Camping Regulations, the Saskatchewan Regional Parks Act, or Brightsand Lake Regional Park Bylaws may result in fines or eviction. **

ADDITIONAL CAMPING REGULATIONS FOR GROUP CAMPING

A) All group campsites must contain a minimum of two units, Group 9 & 11 limited to 2 units per site, Group 10 is limited to 3 units per site; Group 6 & 7 number of units at the manager's discretion. When reserving a group site, you must provide the names of the individuals who will be camping on the group site. Each individual camping unit must pay the reservation fee as well as the applicable site deposit at the time of reservation.

B) Each site will be provided with one fire pit and one picnic table. Additional tables may be requested at the main office. Limit of two (2) Park tables per group site at any time, subject to availability.

ADDITIONAL CAMPING REGULATIONS FOR SEASONAL CAMPERS

Seasonal campers must sign a Site Agreement with BSLRP Board.
