

# BYLAWS

## MANITOU & DISTRICT REGIONAL PARK AUTHORITY

A BYLAW of the Manitou District Regional Park Authority to provide for the protection, care, management and control of park areas to ensure their use and enjoyment as public parks and pleasure grounds; and for the conduct of persons residing in or making use of park areas.

The Manitou & District Regional Park Authority, hereinafter referred to as "Park Authority" enacts as follows:

### Land Area

1. In this Bylaw the expression "park area" means any area set aside by the Park Authority as a public park or playground area and shall include: The following lands in Township Thirty-two (32) in Range Twenty-five (25), West of the Second (W2nd) Meridian, in the province of Saskatchewan.

**FIRSTLY: Golf Course** - The North East Quarter of Section 3-32-25 W2 Except:

- (a) (Lagoon) Parcel "B" as shown on a Plan of Record in the Land Titles Office for the Saskatoon Land Registration District as No. 87S07979, containing 2.95 hectares more or less;
- (b) 2.215 hectares (5.473 acres) more or less, taken for a roadway as shown on a Plan of Record in the said Land Titles office as No. 80S35894;
- (c) All that portion as shown on a Plan of Record in the said Land Titles office as No 62S19578; Subject to easements for roadway and sewer line easement in favor of the Resort Village of Manitou Beach;

**SECONDLY: Kitchen/Picnic Area West of Tennis Courts (area leased to Village of Manitou Beach)** That portion of the fractional South Half of Legal Subdivision 1 of Section 10-32-25-W2nd, not covered by the waters of Little Manitou Lake as shown upon a Plan of Survey dated 19th of December, 1906, and lying east of a line drawn parallel with the east boundary of said Section and perpendicularly distant 300 feet west therefrom;

**THIRDLY: Pasture area on West side of Camp Easter Seal** All that portion of the South West Quarter of Section 10-32-25-W2nd which lies to the South of Little Manitou Lake as the same is from day to day not covered by the waters of the said Lake.

**FOURTHLY: Tennis Courts & Beach area (area leased to Village of Manitou Beach)** All that portion of the South West Quarter of Section 11 lying to the South of Little Manitou Lake as the same is from day to day not covered by the waters of the said Lake,

Except:

- (a) All that portion of the said Quarter Section shown as Parcel "B" on a Plan of Record in the Saskatoon Land Titles Office as No. 87S40727;

(b) All that portion of the said Quarter Section described within Certificate of Title No. 77S04085 containing 0.05 of an acre, more or less.

FIFTHLY: **Main Campground Area** Block "E" in the North West Quarter of Section 2-32-25-W2nd in the Village of Manitou Beach according to a Plan of Record in the SAID Land Titles Office as No. 68S9755

Except: that portion taken for roadway as shown on Plan No. 68S19755

SIXTHLY: **Seasonal Sites and Mason Meadows Area (99 year lease from Village of Manitou Beach)**

Firstly, Commencing at the south west corner of the said LS 11 thence easterly along the southerly boundary of said LS 11 a distance of five hundred and thirty three (533) feet to a point in the said southerly boundary, thence northerly parallel to the westerly boundary of said LS 11 a distance of six hundred and forty two decimal two (642.2) feet to a point, thence westerly parallel to the southerly boundary of said LS 11 a distance of five hundred and thirty three (533) feet to the north easterly corner of Lot E Plan G10 more commonly know as the Manitou District Regional Park Campground. All of the above area is within the NW Section 02, Township 32, Range 5, West 2 Extension 63 as described on Certificate of Title 85S37275

Definitions

"Peace Officer" means:

(I) a member of a police force in Saskatchewan;

(II) a person or class of persons designated by the Lieutenant Governor in Council as traffic officers: or

(iii) any person appointed under the Police Act as a special constable or peace officer for the enforcement of this Act.

"Officer" means any person employed in connection with the administration and management of the park area.

"Domestic Animal" includes any head of cattle, horses, mules, assess, sheep, goats, swine, dogs or cats.

"Vehicle" means a device in, on or by which a person or things is or may be transported or drawn on a highway and includes special mobile machines and agricultural implements but does not include vehicles running only on rails or solely on railway company property.

Entry Permit

2.The Park Authority may require from time to time that entrance to any park be subject to reasonable conditions including payment of a prescribed fee and thereafter no person shall enter such park except on payment of such fee.

Specific Purpose	3. No person shall use any park area set aside for a specific purpose for any other purpose prejudicial to such use except with the permission of an officer.
Fire	<p>4. No person shall, without permission of an officer, light any outdoor fire in the Park area except in the fireplace provided for that purpose and all fires shall be constantly in charge of a competent person until extinguished.</p> <p>5. No bonfire or other exposed fire shall be kindled to dispose of rubbish in any part without a permit to do so which shall state the place and time of such burning and all such burning shall be done between sunrise and 11 pm when a competent person shall be constantly in charge of the fire until it is extinguished.</p>
Litter/Waste	<p>6. No person by himself, or by his servant, agent or employee shall throw, place, deposit, or leave:</p> <p>(a) Any dirt, stones, filth, glass, rubber, plastic, metal, or similar matter of any kind.</p> <p>(b) Any garbage, refuse, rubbish or wastes of any kind: or</p> <p>(c) Any offensive or dangerous matter, in any park area except in a place designated for such a purpose.</p> <p>7. Any person by himself, or by his servant, agent or employee, throwing, placing, depositing or leaving anything referred to in Section 6 in a park area shall within twenty-four (24) hours after having been notified by an officer, remove the same as directed by the notice, and in the event of failure to do so the officer may secure the removal of same, and costs of such removal may be assessed against the person violating section 6.</p>
Temporary Residence	8. No person shall establish any temporary residence, trailer unit or tent in a park area without a permit which may be issued by an officer.
Nuisances and Mischief	9. No area of any park may be used in such a way as to pollute, contaminate or cause other injury to the water within the park area.
Defacing Property	10. No person shall tamper with, deface, cut into, write upon or otherwise disfigure or destroy any natural rock formation, soil, tree, timber, bridge building, seat, <b>fire ring</b> or any other structure in the park area.
Defacing Signs	11. No person shall remove, deface or destroy any notice posted in a park in regard on any matter relating to the administration of the park area.
Dogs	12. No person shall allow or bring any dog upon any bathing area or playground or within any public building within a park. Where dogs and / or pets are allowed within the park, they shall be supervised <b>and</b> suitably restrained. <b>All pets must be kept under physical control by a leash or enclosed pet run. A maximum of three pets per site will be allowed. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets. Pets are not permitted to be left unattended. Dogs must be kept under control, including excessive barking.</b>

Domestic Animals	13. Where any person allows any domestic animal to be in any park area in contravention of this Bylaw, the owner shall be deemed to have Violated the said Bylaw.
Firearms	14. No person shall have in his possession any firearm, airgun, air pistol, bow and arrow or other dangerous weapon or device unless authorized by an officer.  Except with the permission of an officer, no person shall: (a) Hunt, shoot, trap, snare, poison or otherwise destroy or molest an animal or bird: or (b) Carry or have in his possession or discharge any firearm or airgun or any bow and arrow, in within or across the park area.
Fireworks	15. No person shall have or use within any park area any fireworks, firecrackers or other explosive or highly flammable matter except under the authority of a permit which may be issued by an officer.
Traffic	16. No person shall have, drive, or park any vehicle in any park area except on roadways or parking areas designed for the use of vehicles.  17. No person shall use any motorcycle, motor toboggan, or other motor driven or foot-propelled vehicle on foot paths, or playground areas within the park area.  18. The use of dirt bikes, quads, drones or power plants are not allowed in the park area.  19. The speed limit for all vehicles within the park area shall be <b>20</b> kilometers per hour.  20. No <b>unlicensed</b> vehicle shall be parked in the park area.  21. No vehicle shall be parked with the engine running unless under the control of a licenced operator, nor shall any parking be allowed with the engine running within the park limits between the hours of 11:00 pm and 6:00 am;  No person shall “joy-ride” or repeatedly drive up and down the streets or lanes within the Park limits between the hours of 11:00 pm and 6:00 am.
Quiet Time	22. No person shall make any unnecessary noise so as to disturb any other person or persons in the park between the hours of 11:00 pm and 6:00 am.
Traffic Signs	23. The Park Authority may, by resolution, make regulations providing for the erection of signs, signals, markings and devices within the Park for the better enforcement of the provisions of this Bylaw.

Authority of  
Police

24. A police officer is authorized to direct all traffic as the situation requires or as public safety or convenience may require, and no person shall neglect or refuse to comply with any order, signal or direction of a police officer.

A police officer may, without warrant, seize any vehicle that, in his opinion is being operated or is parked in violation of this bylaw and may retain it in his possession or store it in a suitable place until the fine, costs, and expenses of the seizure and the retention or storage are paid.

Where a vehicle has been seized under the previous subsection, no person shall take it out of the possession of the person making the seizure or remove it from the place in which it has been stored without the written consent of a police officer.

Minors

25. No one under the age of 18 may book a campsite without a signed consent form from their parents or guardian. No more than four unrelated people are allowed per site.

Liquor

26. No person under the age of 19 years shall have in his possession any liquor or **illegal substance**, anywhere within the park limits. **The use of alcohol by minors is prohibited.** Nothing in this bylaw shall supersede the applicable sections of the Saskatchewan Liquor Act in respect to unlawful possession of liquor in a public place.

Ejection  
from Park

27. Anyone within the park limits who commits any offence under this bylaw: willfully damages any property: or makes an unnecessary noise so as to disturb any other person or persons in the park, can be ejected from the Park summarily by any police officer, or official of the Manitou & District Regional Park and the actions could result in the loss of the camping site and permit.

28. Any person who is guilty of a violation of any provision of this bylaw, which is not settled as provided for in the above described procedure, is liable to a fine of not less than One Hundred (\$100) dollars and not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) dollars, and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days.
