

## Bylaw # 1-70 of the McLeod Regional Park Authority

A Bylaw to provide for the protection, care, management and control of the McLeod Regional Park of the Melville District to ensure its use and enjoyment as a public park and pleasure ground and to regulate the conduct of persons residing in or making use of the McLeod Regional Park area and facilities.

The McLeod Regional Park Authority enacts as follows:

1. In this Bylaw the expressions

(1) "PARK AREA" mean and shall include.

All that portion of Parcel "B" in the City of Melville, in the Province of Saskatchewan, in the Dominion of Canada, according to a Plan of Record in the Land Titles Office for the Yorkton Land Registration District as No. 68-Y-01286

-and

All that portion of Parcel "D" in the City Of Melville, in the Province Of Saskatchewan, in the Dominion of Canada, according to a Plan of Record in the Land Titles Office for the Yorkton Land Registration District as No. T.3111, as amended by Master of Titles by Order registered as No. 70-Y-00662, being that portion lying North of Highway No. 10 according to a Road Plan registered as No. 67-Y-09550.

(2) "OFFICER" shall mean any member of the McLeod Regional Park Authority and Any person specifically appointed by the McLeod Regional Park Authority to be an officer.

(3) "POLICE OFFICER" shall mean any member of the RCMP and any person specifically appointed by the McLeod Regional Park Authority to be a peace officer.

(4) "VEHICLE" means any automobile, truck, trailer, or other conveyance, as defined in the Vehicles Act for the Province of Saskatchewan.

2. The McLeod Regional Park Authority may require from time to time that entrance to the Park area be subject to reasonable conditions including payment of a prescribed fee and at such times no person shall enter the park except on payment of such fee.

3. The McLeod Regional Park Authority may require that entrance of vehicles to the Park area be subject to conditions including payment of a prescribed fee and thereafter no vehicle shall enter the Park area except on payment of such fee.
4. No person shall use any park area set aside for a specific purpose for any other purpose prejudicial to such use except with the permission of an officer.
5. No person shall light any outdoor fire in the Park area except in a fire-place or barbeque provided for that purpose without a permit obtained from an Officer.
6. No person by himself, or by his servant, agent or employee shall throw, place, deposit or leave:-
  - (a) any dirt, stones, filth, glass, rubber, plastic, metal or similar matter of any kind; or
  - (b) any garbage , refuse, rubbish or wastes of any kind; or
  - (c) any offensive or dangerous matter; in any park area except in a place designated for such purpose.
7. No person shall establish any temporary residence, trailer unit or tent in a park area without a permit which may be issued by an officer.
8. Any person using any cabin, trailer, tenting or other area shall keep such area in a clean and satisfactory state.
9. No area of the Park may be used in such a way as to pollute, contaminate or cause other injury to any property in McLeod Regional Park.
10. No person shall tamper with, deface, cut into, write upon or otherwise disfigure, destroy, or injure any natural rock formation, soil, tree, timber, building, bridge, fence, seat, sign or any other structure, equipment or growth.
11. No person shall remove, deface or destroy any notice posted in the Park area in regard to any matter relating to the administration of the Park.
12. No person shall allow or bring any dog upon a bathing area or playground or within any public building within the park. Dogs must be restrained in the rest of the Park Area.
13. Where any person allows any domestic animal to be in the Park Area in contravention of this Bylaw, the owner shall be deemed to have violated the said Bylaw except in areas to be specified by the Authority.
14. No person shall have in his possession any firearm, airgun, air pistol, bow and arrow or other dangerous weapon or device unless authorized by an Officer.
15. No person shall have or use within the Park area any fireworks, firecrackers, or other explosive or highly flammable matter except under the authority of a permit which may be issued by an officer.
16. Except with the permission of an office, no person shall:
  - (1) hunt, shoot, trap, snare, poison or otherwise destroy or molest an animal or bird: or
  - (2) Carry or have in his possession or discharge any firearm or airgun or any bow and arrow; in, within or across any park area.
17. No person may operate a motor vehicle except on established roadways within the geographical limits of the McLeod Regional Park and no person may park a motor vehicle except on lots and campsites situated within the geographical limits of said McLeod

Regional Park and provided for that purpose of said McLeod Regional Park and provided for that purpose by the McLeod Regional Park Authority, provided however, that any person operating a motor vehicle on established roadways and/or on any campsite in said McLeod Regional Park shall not at any time exceed the speed of 15 miles per hour.

18. No person shall park or drive a motor vehicle upon or across any portion of said McLeod Regional Park except on roadways, parking lots and campsites established for that purpose by the McLeod Regional Park Authority.
19. Notwithstanding anything herein under contained, no person shall drive a snowmobile at any time, in, upon or across any portion of said McLeod Regional Park.
20. During the hours when the swimming pool area is closed to the public, no unauthorized person shall enter the swimming pool area for the purpose of swimming or for any other reason.
21. No person suffering from a communicable or contagious disease shall enter a swimming pool or paddling pool in the Park.
22. The officer in charge, lifeguard or Public Health Nurse is hereby authorized and empowered, on reasonable grounds, to demand from any person before entering a pool, a certificate from a Physician that such person is not suffering from any communicable or contagious disease, and to restrain such person from entering the Pool until such certificate is produced.
23. No person shall engage in the sale of goods, solicitation or display of any sort within the Park Area except by the permission of the McLeod Regional Park Authority.
24. No person shall drive a heavy vehicle within the Park area without a permit which may be issued by an officer:
  - (a) Provided that this section shall not apply to any persons operating a heavy vehicle actually in use in the service of the McLeod Regional Park Authority.
  - (b) For the purposes of this section ``Heavy Vehicle`` shall mean a motor vehicle having a manufacturers rated capacity in excess of one (1) ton or having a wheel base in excess of 159 inches.
25. No person shall drive through or enter upon any roadway or portion thereof, or upon any park area which is roped, barricaded or indicated by notice or sign as being closed.
26. A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Bylaw or fails to comply therewith or with any Notice given thereunder shall commit an offence punishable on summary conviction to the penalties as herein provided for.
27. (1) Any person convicted of a breach of the provisions of this Bylaw shall forfeit and pay at the discretion of the Convicting Judge of the Magistrate`s Court or Justice for the Peace having jurisdiction in the City of Melville a penalty not exceeding \$100.00 DOLLARS exclusive of costs and upon default thereof the person may be committed to a goal or to a public lockup for any time determined by the said Judge or Justice for the Peace not exceeding thirty (30) days unless the penalty and costs are sooner paid, and in addition the convicting Judge or Justice for the Peace may order that a sum equivalent to the value of the thing destroyed, or a sum equivalent to the cost of repairing the thing damaged, as the

case may be, be paid by him forthwith or within a stated period, the said sum or sums to be subsequently handed over to the McLeod Regional Park Authority.

(2) Provided however, that any person who has committed or is alleged to have committed an offence under the following sections of this bylaw may forfeit and pay a voluntary penalty exclusive of costs in the amount hereinafter specified namely:

(3) Provided however that no person who has committed or is alleged to have committed a second or subsequent offence under Section 19 or Section 25 shall be permitted to pay a voluntary penalty but that any person convicted of such further violation of Section 19 or Section 25 shall forfeit and pay a fine exclusive of costs in such amount as may be imposed by the convicting Judge of the Magistrate's Court or Justice of the Peace under Section 27 (1) hereof preceding.

(4) Provided, further, however, that any person convicted of an offence under the following Sections of this bylaw shall forfeit and pay exclusive of costs a fine in the following amount, namely:

(5) Any person convicted of an offence under any Section of this bylaw not covered by Section 27 (2), 27 (3) and 27 (4) hereof preceding shall forfeit and pay a fine, exclusive of costs in such amount as may be imposed by the Convicting Judge of the Magistrate`s Court or Justice of the Peace under Section 27 (1) hereof preceding.

28. 1. Where any person has committed or is alleged to have committed a breach of any of the Sections of this specified in Subsection (2) of Section 27 hereof, a ticket in a form to be approved of by the Chief of Police and McLeod Regional Park Authority may be served on such person. Such person may pay at the office of the Melville City Clerk at the City Hall, in the City of Melville, in the Province of Saskatchewan, between the hours of 9:00 o'clock in the morning and 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon, excepting Sundays and Holidays, in lawful money of Canada an amount equal to the voluntary penalty fixed for the respective Sections specified in the Subsection (2) of Section 27 of this bylaw provided that payment must be made within a period of two days from the service of said ticket or said voluntary penalty may be deposited in the Fine-0-Meters situated from time to time in the City of Melville for that purpose. If payment is made within such time then the person shall not be liable to prosecution for the offence.

2. Service of such ticket may be made by attaching same to the vehicle in respect of which an offence has been committed or by mailing such ticket addressed to the registered owner of the vehicle concerned, or by personal service on the person who has committed the offence.

3. If the person given such ticket fails to pay the voluntary penalty within the time allowed, then the provisions of this section shall no longer apply and the person shall be liable to prosecution for the offence in the ordinary way, provided that nothing in this section shall prevent any person served with such ticket from exercising his right to defend any of these particularized offences.
