



## **Saskatchewan Regional Parks Association Scholastic Award for Student Employees**

Saskatchewan Regional Parks Association recognizes the contribution of our community builders of tomorrow.

The growth of our Regional Parks is an example of the achievements of people working together in their own communities. Regional Parks are a vital part of rural Saskatchewan providing employment and economic benefits to community businesses.

Students have always played a major role in regional parks – first as children enjoying the facilities with their parents, then as employees in perhaps, their first job. Students who are employed at their local regional park retain that “ownership” that keeps them involved in local communities as adults. Regional parks hope to encourage those qualities of good citizenship and cooperation through this Bursary program.

**Amount of Award - \$1500 annually. (Six Bursaries available within the Province)**

### **Eligibility:**

- Must have been employed at a Saskatchewan Regional Park in 2020 for a minimum of 240 hours.
- Must be a recent graduate of a Saskatchewan high school and beginning your first year of post-secondary education or continuing full time training at any accredited technical or trade school or university during the fall of 2020.
- Must apply the Award toward expenses for **full time training** at any accredited technical, trade school or university.
- Must be a Saskatchewan resident.
- Preference will be given to students with previous work experience in a Regional Park (2+ years).
  
- **Qualifications:**
- Must have demonstrated a contribution to Saskatchewan through a combination of volunteer and or work activities.
- Must have a good academic record – at least a “B” average standing.
